- **2. Lower Costs** Lead a comprehensive approach to increase options for employer-sponsored health coverage, and continue to focus on surprise medical bills, rising drug costs, and long-term care for our aging population.
- **3. Enhance Transparency** Adopt sweeping price transparency legislation to empower patients with prices that are predictable, accessible, and useful and that nudge our health care sector towards the free market
- **4. Expand Access -** Enact solutions that increase access to healthcare for all Hoosiers, including those in rural areas, by embracing technology, supporting local providers, and empowering patients.
- **5. Promote Wellness -** Prioritize wellness through access to preventative care and screening while pursuing policies that encourage Hoosiers to live healthier lifestyles.
- **6. Increase Competition -** Indiana needs to cut red tape and remove barriers to entry, ensuring Hoosiers aren't harmed by consolidation or overregulation.
